

Consistory Minutes of Meeting

May 16, 2021

The meeting was called to order at 8:30 by President Margaret Stouffer.

Devotions were given by Jeff Stouffer.

Work of the Church:

Agenda Additions & Subtractions: Correction to the minutes are – add Sydnae Vanner to the roll call for the April 18th meeting...sorry Sydnae!!! Also, corrected Pastor Mark's spelling of last name to Ruzicka...sorry Pastor Mark!!!!

Consent Agenda was approved unanimously after above corrections noted.

Information Agenda:

Marg noted the Boro has approached her regarding renting Grace's Social Hall for their meetings the first Monday of the month if additional space is needed. They will contact her if they want to use the room & they will set up the tables and chairs themselves.

Activities Committee: Laundry Love is still delayed due to close proximity. Chet reported the ham sandwich and soup sale was profitable making \$1033.00 & a donation of \$100.00 to the Food Pantry at the Evangelical Lutheran Church. Considering increasing the prices. Breakfast Fundraiser revealed 72 meals being served with 22 walk-ins. Yard Sale is slated for July 9th & 10th. To begin bringing in treasures on June 15th for the sale. Marg has been in touch with Chris. Chris & Melissa (owners of next door businesses) regarding this fundraiser & parking. Chet will obtain the yard sale permit from Boro Hall.

Building & Grounds: Congregational Meeting on the slate for May 23rd to vote on roof work. Mark pointed out the roof at the Bell tower is fixed as is the refrigerator. He also said there are dates on the walls in the Bell Tower (2001 Bonded Applicators done the work, 1983, 1957, 1930) of when the roof had been repaired. It looks like it will be an every 20 year project. Jeff has touched up painting on the molding at the elevator. Steve has run cables to the social hall for WiFi to accommodate the Boro for their meetings and the cost was adjusted showing a minimal increase. Mark added that he is waiting on a quote from Eagle Construction for repairing the ceiling in the vestibule as well as one from John Lehman.

Jeff pointed out that West Penn Power prices have increased as well as gas prices going up 26%. He suggested turning off the hot water heater and gas line to the stove when not in use & this will be done. Additionally, consistory approved 2 new hearing devices (currently have 4) from Sunrise Computers at the cost of \$240.00 which donations of \$140 were made to help cover.

Parsonage Payment Plan: with Brenda Clark & Mike. May payment is in the bank via Pay Pal. The March payment still has not been received & Mike filed a request to have it traced. Larry will request documentation again.

Finance Committee: Larry reported that up to May 15th offerings have increased 34% over last year. Finances are on track and we have not had to take money from of investments to pay expenses. Regarding the reimbursement from Hylant (Workman's Comp) and Insurance Board for Parsonage, Jeff & Margaret will check with Elaine to get clarification of the refunds of the cancellation for the parsonage insurance & the Hylant plan.

Guest Pastors for July: Are arranged for every Sunday in July when Pastor Mark is on vacation. The Pastors are staff of the Conference and will be paid by the Conference. Consideration is being given to present each Pastor with a gift card as well.

Church Picnic is scheduled for September 12th and Carolyn will reserve pavilion via Jody Bittner.

By a motion by Mark, a second by Carolyn and a unanimous vote, it was decided to not meet in June or July unless an emergency meeting is needed.

Meeting was adjourned at 9:25 after the Lord's Prayer.

- 2. Vote on repairing of the ceiling at the entrance to the sanctuary

Marg opened the meeting to explain the recent contact made by Grand Point to possibly use our Social Hall on Sunday's for their Youth Ministry. There were many questions and concerns voiced and a meeting was scheduled to meet with their leaders on Wednesday, August 4 at 3:30. Marg, Sydnae and Carolyn agreed to meet with them to address our questions and concerns. A decision will pursue at an Emergent Consistory Meeting to be held at 6:30 that evening to review and vote on this matter.

Estimates for the ceiling at the entrance to the sanctuary are as follows:

Artisan Drywall - \$12,240.00

Mount Taber (John Lehman) – Drywall, lights, dispose of old tile - \$6575.00

Drop Ceiling, lights, dispose of old tile - \$5700.00

After discussion, Marg made a motion to go with the drop ceiling by Mount Taber, Sydnae seconded, and the motion carried with an unanimous vote. Mark will contact John Lehman to get on their schedule to have completed ASAP.

EMERGENT CONSISTORY MEETING

August 4, 2021

IN ATTENDANCE: Pastor Mark, Marg & Jeff Stouffer, Sydnae Vanner, Carolyn Shoemaker, Mark Stahl, & Cathy Keefer (Lu & Steve Miller attended via cell phone)

Marg opened the meeting at 6:30 and reviewed the discussion she, Sydnae, and Carolyn had with the Youth Leaders from Grand Point regarding their interest in using Grace's Social Hall to build their Youth Ministry in the Greencastle area. They will be having adult services at B Street restaurant.

Issues addressed:

- 1. Grand Point agreed to an alternative space (Little Chapel or meeting room) in the event that Grace needed the Social Hall
- 2. Wi-Fi or other technology is not needed. They will provide their own TV, etc.
- 3. Youth would be ages K thru 5th grade (approximately 10 to 15 children)

- 4. Supervision would be two adults which includes a Security Guard. Parents would drop their child off at the side door and be escorted inside by the Security Guard.
- 5. Parking would be in the B Street parking lot across Baltimore Street
- 6. Grand Point would use our tables and chairs and arrange to their needs
- 7. No snacks provided or no need to use the kitchen
- 8. They will not be using the piano
- 9. Grand Point will provide a copy of their liability insurance
- 10.A schedule will be provided for usage with begin date to be August 8th for staff only and full launch of services to begin September 19th at 9 am and 11 am.
- 11. Rental would be \$100.00 per Sunday and to be paid monthly at the first of the month.
- 12. Timeframe of usage is uncertain at this time but could be up to a year
- 13.A schedule would need worked out by Grace for opening and closing of the church after Grand Point's services.

Discussion transpired by the Consistory Members and Marg made a motion to agree to accommodate Grand Point, Jeff seconded, and all in attendance voted in favor. Marg penned an agreement and will present to their leaders on Sunday, August 8th. We decided to do occasional reviews to ascertain things were working out for both parties.

Additionally, the decision was made to inform the congregation via phone message of this upcoming venture and Marg will compose and have Elaine complete the recording on Thursday and to have any questions answered after Worship on Sunday, August 8th.
