The Advent and Christmas Season is such a special time, filled with holy experiences. Simply put, it is when God becomes a child in Jesus and sees the world through the eyes of a child. We can learn to do this at Christmas as well...to see the world through the eyes of a child...and also the eyes of God.

This idea reminds me of a song by Patsy Cline. Some of the lyrics are:

If I could see the world

Through the eyes of a child

Smiling faces would greet me all the while

Like a lovely work of art

It would warm my weary heart

Just to see through the eyes of a child

I could see right--no wrong
I could see good-- no bad
I could see all the good things in life I've never had
If I could see the world
Through the eyes of a child
What a wonderful world this would be.

One of the things I remember from my Christmas and childhood days...is visiting **Koziar's Christmas Village** with my extended family. Christmas Village is a large outdoor lights display in Bernville, PA (northwest of Reading). The Village started with just one couple and their four children, back about 75 years from today. For me, it is a symbol of looking at the world with wonder and awe and innocence. Do you have a similar experience in your life?

To look back on those days is not just nostalgia, it is also our spiritual grounding. Remember Jesus said we should welcome God's kingdom like a child (Mark 10:15). And, as the Apostle Paul puts it in Philippians 4:8: Finally, beloved, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is pleasing, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things.




Elections

Consistory Minutes of Meeting

August 15, 2021

Roll Call: Margaret Stouffer, Steve Miller, Jeff Stouffer, Mark Stahl, Sydnae Vanner, Carolyn Shoemaker, Cathy Keefer, Chet Nye, Lu Miller, Pastor Mark Ruzicka, Larry Stepler

The meeting was called to order at 8:32 am by President Margaret Stouffer.

Devotions: Devotions and prayer by Pastor Mark.

Work of the Church: It was decided to continue to ask congregation to self monitor with mask restrictions.

Agenda Additions: Skit Guys renewal, Air conditioners, Parking and Oneway alley were added to the agenda.

Consent Agenda: Motion by S. Vanner/ C. Shoemaker to accept consent agenda with corrections passed unanimously.

Information Agenda:

Pastor Mark: Would like to start Called to Care Training on Wednesday evenings 6:00 to 6:30. Bible Study would be 6:30 to 7:10 on the Gospel of Mark. He would like to start these on Wednesday, September 8. Signup sheets will be placed for participants.

Activities Committee: The yard sale went very well. First Saturday meals are going very well. The committee will address and issue that arose at the last meal. Next fundraising meeting will be September 7.

Building and Grounds: Steve will contact Dependable Roofing questioning when they will be starting roof painting. He reported that the one air conditioner is not working and will contact Premier HVAC to look at it. Mt. Tabor revised their quote to approximately \$5300 to install a drop ceiling in the vestibule outside the sanctuary. On a S. Miller/ M. Stouffer motion, Mark Stahl will get estimates to replace the carpet in the vestibule and landings on the stairways. He will donate his time to install the carpet. He will get carpet squares to match the new carpet inside the main door. It passed unanimously. Mark Stahl will get samples of ceiling tile for the consistory to approve from Mt. Tabor. Parking – The alley next to the church (Church Lane) was made a one way alley. A motion by C. Shoemaker/ L. Miller to allow the Building and Grounds committee to make a decision to remove the concrete parking stops in the parking lot to allow entrance and exit from the side alley. An announcement will be made to the congregation of this action.

Finance: Reimbursement from Hylant Workman's Comp has been taken care of. Monies from the Showalter estate was discussed. Clarification will be obtained from Larry for next meeting.

Guest pastors for July: Feedback on the guest pastors was very positive. Glad to have Pastor Mark back!

Grand Point: At this time the use of the social hall by Grand Point has been put on hold.

Peach Social: A peach social will be held for congregation and guests on August 29 after worship in the social hall. Carolyn Shoemaker and Deb Homer will be spearheading this.

Church Picnic: Will be held on September 12. Pavilion has been reserved. There will be a sign up sheet placed so we will know how much chicken to order.

The next meeting will be held September 19, 2021 at 8:30 am.

The meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer at 9:40 am.

Consistory Minutes of Meeting

September 19, 2021

Roll Call: Margaret Stouffer, Steve Miller, Lu Miller, Jeff Stouffer, Mark Stahl, Sydnae Vanner, Chet Nye, Pastor Mark Ruzicka, Carolyn Shoemaker. Absent: Cathy Keefer, Larry Stepler

The meeting was called to order at 8:30 am by President Margaret Stouffer.

Devotions: Scripture and prayer was given by Pastor Mark Ruzicka.

Work of the Church: There were no changes in the standing precautions measures for COVID.

Agenda Additions and Subtractions: Two additions to the Information Agenda were organ repair information and request for communion supplies.

Consent Agenda: Motion by S. Vanner/ C. Shoemaker to accept the consent agenda passed unanimously.

Information Agenda: Committee is working on updating the wedding policy. The couple who requested use of the sanctuary will be getting back to us.

Pastor Mark: Mercersburg Association of UCC churches in the area will be having their Fall meeting on October 31 from 3:00 to 5:00 pm. This will be a ZOOM meeting. Called to Care and the Bible Study on Wednesday evenings is going very well with 8-10 persons attending.

Activities Committee: Grace's Closet is reporting that they are overwhelmed with the amount of donations and would like more space to store off season items. Everything is organized in totes and they are expecting a donation of more totes to store items. Different options were discussed. It was decided that Margaret, Carolyn, Sydnae, Chet will meet with Nancy, Jean, Mildred and Tammy to come up with a solution.

Building and Grounds: Painting of the roof is completed. The air conditioning unit was repaired. The electrical line to the garage has not been repaired yet. Steve will check with Troy Layton regarding when he will be repairing it. Layton submitted an estimate, but we would like to see an itemized statement. Steve will be asking Troy about this also. Mt. Tabor will start to replace the ceiling tile on Wednesday September 22 at 8:00. Mark will be checking on the progress throughout the week to see we will have access to the sanctuary by the front door for Sunday services. Otherwise the congregation can use the elevator and back stairs for access. Mark will be checking with the Borough about having a dumpster along the sidewalk for the ceiling tiles that are being removed.

Finance Committee: Payment has been received from Mike and Pastor Brenda with an additional \$25 via PayPal. Margaret will ask if this extra amount is to go toward the March payment that was never received. The portable speaker that we had and wanted to use for the church picnic does not work. Steve had it looked at by a music store and was told it was beyond repair. A new portable speaker was purchased at a cost of \$200. The Comcast account will need to be reviewed. Jeff will be looking at this. A question was asked about the budget for next year. Larry Stepler will be contacting us when it is ready to be reviewed.

Parish Nurse: It was suggested that an emergency kit be placed in the sanctuary. Jan Shafer will be asked to take the lead on this project.

Parking: There has been a vehicle consistently parking along the sidewalk just outside the entrance to Grace's Closet. Margaret will ask this person to please park in the parking lot as to not block the entrance.

Grand Point: At this time they have started services at B Street, but we have not heard if they are still interested in using the Social Hall for children's services.

Organ Repairs: The consistory has received a letter from Lawless Organ regarding repairs needed. Problems found include chimes need to be regulated, stoppers are slipping and loose and there are six dead notes on the entire organ. It was recommended by Lawless that we fix the slipping stoppers and chime regulation not to exceed \$1600.00. To fix the dead notes would require extensive work. To replace the current control system with a new one would be around \$55,000.00. Susan is aware of the dead notes and accommodates it. A motion was made by S. Miller/ J. Stouffer to repair the slipping stoppers and chime regulation at a cost not to exceed \$1600.00. Motion passed unanimously. We will be looking for fund raiser ideas for the remainder of repair work that should be done.

Communion supply request: Margaret asked permission to use the communion plates to serve communion at her son's wedding. Permission was granted.

Action Agenda: Staff reviews will need to be done soon. The officers of consistory will meet with Elaine, Susan, Patty and Pastor Mark in the near future. Nomination for consistory were discussed.

The next meeting will be October 17, 2021 at 8:30 am. Steve Miller will be leading the meeting in Margaret's absence. The meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer at 9:35 am.
