Consistory Minutes of Meeting

October 17, 2021

Roll Call: Carolyn Shoemaker, Sydnae Vanner, Chet Nye, Steve Miller, Lu Miller, Pastor Mark Ruzicka, and by telephone Mark Stahl. Absent: Margaret Stouffer, Jeff Stouffer, Larry Stepler

The meeting was called to order by Vice-President Steve Miller at 8:32 am.

Devotions: Scripture was read by Pastor Mark Ruzicka.

Work of the church: It was agreed to continue with the current COVID precautions.

Agenda additions and subtractions: None.

Consent Agenda: Motion by C. Shoemaker/ C. Nye to accept the consent agenda passed unanimously.

Information Agenda:

Pastor Mark reported that the couple asking to use the church for a wedding has postponed it until the Fall of 2022. Pastor Mark reminded us that Nov. 28 is the first Sunday of Advent. Decorating of the church will be on Nov. 21 after the service. A light meal will be served after services. Carolyn Shoemaker and Deb Homer will be spearheading the meal. Pastor Mark is asking for December 26 off. We will check with Patty and Susan regarding a service of "Lessons in Carols".

Fundraising: A spaghetti meal will be served on October 23. Tickets are being sold at this time. November 6 is First Saturday Meal. This will be a Thanksgiving meal. Apple dumpling fundraiser will be held on November 19. Orders will be taken with any dumplings left over to be sold at the Christmas Parade the next day.

Activities: Chet reported that Grace's Closet workers have been working diligently in getting the clothing and items reorganized. The tubs that were on the stage have been moved to the seasonal room. At this time the Closet is not taking any new items.

Building and grounds: It was brought to consistory's attention that a new vacuum cleaner is needed in the kitchen area. Carolyn S. and Deb Homer will take the lead on this. The ceiling tile and electric has been completed outside the sanctuary. We have not received the bills for this work yet. The electric work done in the parking lot is completed. The church will pay the bill and be reimbursed by the person who did the damage. Mark's Lawn Care send notice that they will only plow snow in the parking lot. They will no longer do the sidewalk. Steve M reached out to Briar Wingert (who currently does the mowing of the cemetery) to submit a bid to shovel the sidewalks both at the church and at the cemetery. He will also ask to have Ice Melt put down on the sidewalks.

Finance: Grace's Closet will be paying for trash service with money given to the closet from the gentleman who takes the clothing that will not be put out for the next season.

Parking question: We will follow up with Margaret regarding the black SUV.

Grand Point: This is on hold.

Action Agenda:

Parish Nurse: Lorna Thomas and Jan Shafer presented estimates to have a new AED placed outside the sanctuary and to replace the AED currently outside the classrooms in the hallway which is outdated. Ron and Jan Shafer have donated the new AED for outside the sanctuary. A motion by C. Shoemaker/S. Miller to buy a replacement AED for the one downstairs passed unanimously. There will be training held for administration of the AEDs in the near future.

The meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.

The next meeting will be November 21, 2021 at 8:30 am in the social hall.

November 21, 2021

The meeting was called to order by President Margaret Stouffer at 8:35 a.m.

Devotions: Scripture was read by Pastor Mark Ruzicka.

Work of the church: It was agreed to continue with the current COVID precautions.

Agenda Additions and Subtractions:

Consent Agenda: A motion to accept the consent agenda by C. Shoemaker/ C. Nye passed unanimously.

Information Agenda:

Pastor Mark: Pastor Mark reminded us that the 275th anniversary of the forming of Grace UCC will be in 2023. It was suggested that a committee be formed to plan for this celebration. Also it was suggested that a committee be formed to celebrate Old Home Week in 2022. It was suggested that the rental fee for use of the social hall be waived for any Old Home Week activities.

Activities and Fundraising committee: They are starting to look into the New Year and plan activities. It was suggested perhaps a musical be planned to benefit the organ fund with possible participants being Cumberland Valley School of Music or perhaps an organ recital.

Building and grounds: The round window above the social hall needs to be scraped and repainted. Bathroom pipes are clogging easily. Signs will be put up to flush toilet paper only. Parking lot wire repair bill was received and paid. When Mr. Schaeffer was contacted about paying we were told to submit it to his insurance company. Margaret will be contacting our insurance company as well as his insurance company. It was suggested that the garages be inspected periodically. Mark S. will speak with the tenant.

Finance: When updating the policies a question was raised if the treasurer and secretary should be bonded. The conference will be contacted for recommendations. Larry Stepler will be asked about periodic audits with the CPA.

Parish Nurse: Both AEDs are in. One will be in the back of the sanctuary and the other will be in the hallway closer to the social hall.

Parking question: It was decided to do nothing about the black SUV parking along the sidewalk as this is a public thorough way.

Facebook marketplace issue: Someone has hacked into the church's Facebook account and posted items for sale. After receiving monies, the items are never sent to the buyer. This issue has been taken care of by changing the password for the account.

Action Agenda:

We received solicitation to have an industrial appraisal done for insurance. After contacting Bitner/Henry Insurance (our insurance carrier) it was decided this was not necessary. A motion by J. Stouffer/ C. Nye to drop the industrial appraisal passed unanimously.

A handout of Wedding, Social Hall use, Consistory Committees & Members was handed out. A motion by M. Stouffer/ S. Miller to accept the Wedding and Rental guidelines passed unanimously.

Heritage Christmas in Greencastle will be held the first two Fridays of December. The Guild will be handing out candy canes. It was suggested to add the Cantata and Christmas Eve services to the message accompanying the candy canes.

On a motion by S. Vanner/ L. Miller, Pastor Mark was asked to be the settled pastor for Grace UCC, starting 2022, which passed unanimously. This will be brought before the congregation.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:40 a.m.
