What do I need to do if . . .

I sign up to be a Greeter/Usher . . .

- Arrive 15 to 20 minutes early to church.
- One person greets people at the front doors downstairs. The other greets and hands out bulletins at the top of the stairs.
- Take church attendance by placing a check next to each person's name in attendance.
- When it is time to collect offering, proceed to the front of the sanctuary and receive the offering plates from the Pastor. Go to the outside isle and collect the offering from the front to the back. Come across the back of the sanctuary to the center isle and collect the offering from the back to the front of the sanctuary. Meet the Pastor at the front of the sanctuary to return the offering plates to the Pastor.

I sign up to serve Communion . . .

- With your partner, you will need to provide and prepare the elements.
 - You will need to bring cubed bread and a dinner roll sliced
 34" through from top to bottom.
 - Juice is provided in the kitchen refrigerator.

- Serving trays are stored in the top cupboards on the stage. You will need;
 - 4 trays with holes to hold the communion cups, 2 bases, and
 2 lids.
 - The small silver plate and silver chalice.
 - o 1 small white linen cloth.
 - White plastic Communion cup filler.
 - Plastic communion cups (50 per sleeve)
- At this time, prepare enough juice cups for 50 (25 in each tray, 2 trays)
- Also, enough cups with cubed bread for 50 (25 in each tray, 2 trays)
- Stack the base, 2 trays, and lid. One stack with the Communion juice and one with the bread.
- Put some juice in the chalice. Place the linen cloth open over the silver plate. Place the roll on top and fold the linen over the roll.
- Put everything on a kitchen cart to take to the sanctuary by way of the elevator.

The table for the elements is in the hallway at the top of the elevator. It will need to be carried in and set up on the lower platform in the front of the sanctuary. Push back far enough so people can walk around it.

Place the communion trays, chalice, and plate with roll on the table.

After service, everything needs to be cleaned up and put away.

For anyone who has questions or needs a helping hand, ask anyone on consistory. Everyone is helpful and willing to assist you.



LENTEN BIBLE STUDY



Do you know that 85% of Christians admit to being stuck in their walk with Christ? We can change this. During this season of Lent, join your neighbors and be transformed by the revolutionary content of Emotionally Healthy Spirituality Course. Samples that may give you an idea are in the main hall near Custodial closet. Help yourself to the pans and plastic bags provided.




Ideas include . . .



For January 16, 2022

Absent in person but participated via phone: Lu & Steve Miller

The meeting was called to order by President Margaret Stouffer at 8:30am.

Deb Homer was welcomed as a new consistory member.

DEVOTIONS: Scripture was read by Pastor Mark

WORK OF THE CHURCH: Continue the same COVID precautions

AGENDA ADDITIONS & SUBTRACTIONS: List of dates that The Shop & the Consign & Collect Co. may want to use the church parking lot; Cemetery lawn care; Beaver Mechanical assistance

CONSENT AGENDA: This was accepted and passed unanimously.

INFORMATION AGENDA:

<u>Pastor Mark</u>: He received a letter from Marissa at Penn Central Conference regarding a seminar to be held on May 21st from 10 to 1 pm at St. John's in Chambersburg. It is regarding Growing the Church and is tailored for small churches such as ours. Pastor Mark is excited to teach the next Bible Study to be held during Lent.

Activities and Fundraising: The Next Meeting is scheduled for February 1st. Chet mentioned he is having difficulty getting cherries for the cherry pies but will be working on it. The ham sandwich and soup sale will be coming up.

Building and grounds: Jeff and Marg were called out of bed at 1 o'clock am on Saturday to go to the church to check the excessive steam coming from the exhaust to the boiler. Tim Bryan from Beaver Mechanical was gracious enough to get repairmen that following Monday to replace a leaky valve. The boiler needs to be checked yearly to have maintenance and Jeff or Mark will reach out to Tim Bryan regarding scheduling. Mowing at the cemetery will now be done by Jeff, Mark, Barry, and Jack and it was recommended that two self-propelled mowers and a weedwacker be purchased. Mark noted that rent for both garages are paid in full for the year. Additionally, Margaret presented a list of dates which The Shop and the Consign & Collect Co. are planning a Spring Market and monthly Farmers Markets. There is a liability concern and Jeff will be contacting Carrie Hartman at our insurance carrier. This topic has been tabled until more information is received and is referred to the Building and Grounds Committee.

<u>Finance</u>: Larry presented the budget for 2022 and a motion by Carolyn/Chet to accept the budget and it passed unanimously and it will be presented at the Congregational meeting on January 23, 2022. He noted there was no money taken from the IMA account for expenses. Regarding pay increases, it was suggested to look at the cost of living index either in the middle of the year or in October or November. Grace's Closet is now paying for the trash pick-up monthly and helps out occasionally with electric bill.

<u>Called to Care</u>: Had their first meeting and they are doing their work with making contacts.

<u>Streaming</u>: Steve mentioned he and Lu watched the online service and was "spotty" with hesitations and is not good. To be continued...

ACTION AGENDA:

Motion to have Pastor Mark Ruzicka as our Settled Pastor was made by Carolyn/Chet and was passed unanimously and will be voted on by the congregation on January 23rd.

<u>Policies and Procedures</u>: These were in with the consistory packets for our review and passed for approval.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:30 am with the Lord's Prayer.
