


A beautiful oak, engraved wall hanging by Jeff Stouffer will be available through a silent auction. It has the same 275th Anniversary information as stated above for the throw.


We will be receiving offerings for One Great Hour of Sharing during service on March 19.

CONSISTORY MEETING MINUTES

DECEMBER 11, 2022

ROLL CALL: Jeff Stouffer, Chet Nye, Deb Homer, Carolyn Shoemaker, Lorna Thomas, Mark Stahl, Cathy Keefer. Guests present were Tim Bryan & Ron Shafer.

DEVOTIONS & PRAYER: Jeff shared the "Prayer of the Day".

CONSENT AGENDA: The November Minutes were approved unanimously after a Lorna/Carolyn motion. The Treasurer's Report was approved unanimously after a Carolyn/Chet motion.

INFORMATION AGENDA UPDATES:

Activities/Fundraising - Chet reported there were 29 meals served at the December 3rd First Saturday Free Meal with \$82.00 in donations. Sue Eckstine from the Lutheran Church presented a check in the amount of \$379.00. (\$100.00 went towards electricity from Grace's Closet & \$279.00 is for fundraising). January First Saturday meal is ravioli & February is chicken corn soup & grilled cheese sandwiches. Building/Grounds — Mark said the painting in the men's bathroom has started. Regarding the issue of the use of the bathrooms during Grace's Closet hours, the first option is to place yellow tape & signs to indicate the bathrooms cannot be used. Nancy Myers has purchased 3 electronic buzzers to be placed at the bathroom doors during the Closet's hours of Monday and Wednesday.

ACTION AGENDA:

<u>Finance</u> – Larry presented a tentative budget for 2023 showing the 2022 proposal along with the 2022 actual expense along with a tentative 2023 proposal. We were \$16,000.00 over in the 2022 proposal. Various questions were asked and answered and/or explained by Larry. A decision to adjust the salaries for the four paid positions was discussed and was tabled for each member to ponder. A meeting was set up for Wednesday, December 14th at 6:30 to discuss the payroll adjustment as well to discuss the budget in more detail.

Numerous avenues to pursue decreasing expenses include:

- 1. Communicating with Nate at Backyard Fishing Agency to set up Paycheck
- **Protection Program**

- 2. Consider changing lighting to LED to reduce electrical expense Report will be forthcoming
- 3. Switching to Truist for accounting services from Charles Strausbaugh & Associates potentially decreasing costs from \$2800.00 per year to \$1300.00.
- 4. Reducing lighting usage even during activities

Additionally, we need to be creative in determining how to increase income for the church either by more fundraisers, renting/leasing several rooms out to a small business, etc. Suggestions are welcome!!!

The congregational meeting will be held on January 15, 2023 after service with the voting of 2 new members which we are hoping to have Tim Bryan and Ron Shafer join consistory to replace Jeff Stouffer and Mark Stahl.

Meeting was adjourned at 9:30 with The Lord's Prayer.

2023 BUDGET REVIEW

DECEMBER 14, 2022

ROLL CALL: Pastor Mark, Jeff Stouffer, Carolyn Shoemaker, Deb Homer, Chet Nye, Mark Stahl, Cathy Keefer, Lorna Thomas by phone. Guests present were Tim Bryan and Ron Shafer

The meeting was called to order by President, Jeff Stouffer. Larry Stepler presented a clarification on the timing of preparing for the budget and just how volatile the gain/loss of the investment funds can be. Some of the items showing as expenses are not really expenses per say. Our losses at Morgan Stanley are not expenses; our advisor fees are not expenses as these are paid by the adjustments to our balances in the investments accounts and are not paid for out of our operational income. More information will follow once the end of the year numbers are made available. Larry will put this information together for review at the January 8th meeting so that we will be able to present the Proposed 2023 Budget to the congregation on January 15th.

Discussion then moved to adjustment in salaries for the 4 paid employees. Cathy made a motion to increase their salaries by 4% and Mark seconded it and was approved unanimously.

The meeting was adjourned at 7 o'clock...just in time for choir practice at 7:15!!!

CONSISTORY MEETING MINUTES

JANUARY 8, 2023

ROLL CALL: Pastor Mark, Jeff Stouffer, Mark Stahl, Deb Homer, Carolyn Shoemaker, Chet Nye, Cathy Keefer, Larry Stepler. Guests present were Tim Bryan and Ron Shafer.

DEVOTIONS & PRAYER: Pastor Mark opened the meeting with a morning prayer.

CONSENT AGENDA: The December minutes were approved unanimously after a Deb/Lorna motion. The Treasurer's Report was approved unanimously after a Carolyn/Deb motion.

INFORMATION AGENDA UPDATES:

<u>Activities/Fundraising</u> — Chet reported there were 33 meals served at the First Saturday meal yesterday, January 7th, with donations amounting to \$107.00. The goal for fundraising for 2023 is \$10,000.00.

<u>Building & Grounds</u> – Mark Stahl reported the men's bathroom has the first coat of paint and he'll determine if it will need a second. Carolyn noted the light at the front doors of the church is not working and Jeff and Mark will investigate whether the light bulb is shot. We may consider putting it on a timer to light from 6 to 10 pm.

ACTION AGENDA:

<u>Finance Committee</u> — Larry presented a very detailed update of the year-end finances as well as reviewed the proposed 2023 budget line items and figures. Of note, the church has not had to tap into any of the investment accounts and this is the third year in a row this has occurred. The repayment schedule from Pastor Brenda and Mike has been adjusted to \$200.00 a month as Mike just recently secured employment & presently Pastor Brenda is not working. We have

terminated the services of Charles Strausbaugh CPA, and moved to Truist Bank for Payroll/Accounting services with Elaine doing the payroll. This move will save the church approximately \$1900.00 a year. Larry is still investigating the Employee Retention Credit which is a service to provide small businesses available funds from the federal government. To be continued... Regarding the electrical updates of old fixtures to LED, this has been tabled as more information is needed and Nate Lohr from CadeCor Energy and Lighting has not responded back to Margaret as of today's meeting.

Moving forward it was determined that the Cemetery mowing and weed-whacking will be done by members so as to avoid costing the church a mowing service. Of note, the boiler is antiquated and will need replaced down the road and we are praying it survives a few more years. A boiler fund has been set up in the event it needs repaired/replaced and the congregation is free to make donations to this fund if desired.

The Congregational meeting will be held next Sunday, January 15th, after service. It will involve reviewing and accepting the Proposed 2023 Financial Budget and also holding an election for New Consistory Members who are Ron Shafer & Tim Bryan. Jeff Stouffer & Mark Stahl's terms are up.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:45 a.m. with the Lord's Prayer.

Next meeting will be February 19th at 8:30 a.m.
