From the Pastor's Desk.....

Summer is a great time to read outside. One of the books that I would challenge you to read this year is called *The Interior Castle by* the Spanish mystic and writer, St. Teresa of Avila. It was published in 1588 and is considered one of the most important works in the field of Christian mysticism. I have a copy in my office if you want to borrow it (a translation by Mirabai Starr). But, I'm sure you can find it elsewhere.

According to the "bookey" app, this book is a guide of the soul towards union with God.

St. Teresa describes this journey as a castle made of a single diamond or crystal, with different rooms (or mansions) representing different stages of spiritual development. Each mansion represents a level of intimacy with God and serves as a steppingstone for the soul to move closer to the center, which represents divine union.

To whet your appetite, here are a few quotes from the book:

All the beauty of the world and of the stars is nothing compared to the beauty of the soul.


God dwells within you, within every cell of your being. Seek Him there, in the depths of your own heart. The soul is like a garden, waiting to be tended and cultivated. Only through self-reflection and penance can it bloom into its truest form.

Take solace in the fact that God's love for you is constant, unwavering, and without conditions. You are always worthy of His grace.

The soul is like a spark longing to be reunited with the divine flame. Seek God with all your being and let Him ignite your soul.

The soul is a mirror reflecting the beauty and glory of God. Polish this mirror through prayer and contemplation.
