From the Pastor's Desk.....

I have been in a "historic mode" recently, since we have just observed the 300th anniversary of the German Reformed Church in PA. One of the great writers and teachers of our history is a man by the name of John Williamson Nevin who taught at the Mercersburg Seminary in the mid-1800s. He wrote a book called *The Mystical Presence* which is an invitation to enter into a kind of union with Christ... and letting Christ's Spirit (His life-force) impart a new purpose and meaning to our lives. I think of the great line from the hymn "O Holy Night" that goes: "Till He appeared and the soul felt its worth!"

I can't help but think that this is what we celebrate at Christmas. We learn to **center our lives** around the historical fact and good news that God became one of us in Jesus of Nazareth. Nevin writes, "let the great fact of the incarnation be apprehended with full faith, as a world fact—the center of all history—the fountain of a new creation, which is still present…in the church." Here's another quote from Professor Nevin: "[People] are brought to God, not by doctrine or example, but only by being made to participate in the Divine Nature itself: and this participation is made possible to us only through the person of Christ."



Another of our beloved ancestors is the Rev. Henry Harbaugh. He preached at the dedication of our current church sanctuary. He loved Christmas as well! Here's a funny little anecdote about that from the Mercersburg Historical Society's website:

"Within a few months of his arrival in Mercersburg, he complained about the Presbyterians and wrote that they "spend the day working as on any other day. Their children grow up knowing nothing of brightly lit Christmas trees, nor Christmas presents. God have mercy on these Presbyterians....

Harbaugh enjoyed celebrating Christmas so that he wrote Christmas stories, the most famous of which is "The Star of Bethlehem: A Christmas Story for Good Children" and wrote about Christmas customs in other countries, his own memories of Christmas, and Christmas stories translated from the German...


On December 31,1867, his many friends, former students, and colleagues attended his funeral in the Reformed Church in Mercersburg, which was still decorated for Christmas, a holiday he had always loved."

A Harbaugh Christmas Celebration Saturday, December 6, 2025 at 3 pm






GRACE'S FREE CLOSET

Municipal Primary Elections



Upper Room Daily Devotional Brochures



The meeting was called to order at 8:00 a.m. by President Lorna Thomas.

Devotions: Scripture, Psalm 113 was read by Pastor Mark Ruzicka.

Consent Agenda: The June minutes and budget review minutes and Treasurer's report were approved on a Tim/Steve motion.

Information Agenda:

Pastor Mark

- 1. Local News 1 is a website that articles can be submitted to, and they will have a write up. It was felt that this would be a good way to advertise upcoming events. This was discussed and tabled for the next meeting.
- 2. Pastor Mark will be on vacation November 16th. Scott Bowerman will preach the sermon, and Tony Homer will assist.

- 2. An organ recital to celebrate our refurbished organ return will be discussed at the next meeting.

Finance Committee

- 1. Larry discussed which accounts will be used to finance the roof project.
- 2. He reported that the air conditioning project is completely paid.

Nancy Myers asked for consistory permission to open the closet for an additional 2 Saturdays a month, the second and fourth Saturdays, for clothing to be dropped off. This was approved on a Barry/Ron motion. It was suggested that the bags of clothing be inspected when they are dropped off and can be rejected if not meeting criteria.

Second request was for Nancy to purchase a shed in memory of her mother and father to house the tubs of clothing. The shed will be placed in a corner of our parking lot. This was tabled until next meeting so Nancy could check with the borough regarding any specific requirements.
