From the Pastor's Desk.....


Dear Grace:

Pastor Mark celebrated his 50th birthday on January 28th! Millie & Chet put together a surprise party for him last week!




WELCOME NEW MEMBERS:

LENTEN BOOK STUDY



ORGAN DEDICATION

We are all thankful for Susan, our organist, and our beautiful, restored organ. We rededicated our refurbished organ on Sunday, November 23rd, as an “instrument of praise” to God.



History of the Mollar Organ

(from our website)

The congregation voted in 1951 to have a new organ installed by the M.P. Moller Company of Hagerstown, Maryland.

The two manual pipe organ, installed at a cost of \$10,727.00, was dedicated on November 9, 1953.

In 2025, significant restoration and enhancement work was carried out on the M.P. Moller, Opus 8375 pipe organ. This project was undertaken by Lewis Hitchcock, Inc., operating as Lawless & Associates Pipe Organ Company, Inc., based in Greencastle, PA. The total cost for the refurbishment was \$60,815.75, covering all aspects including organ work, console refinishing, and electrical upgrades. The original tubular-pneumatic combination action of the organ was upgraded with solid state technology, enhancing its reliability and performance. In addition to this major update, the entire organ was rewired, and the console was refinished, restoring its appearance and preserving its historical character. Also, the trompette pipework was cleaned and revoiced, improving its tonal quality and consistency. The organ consists of nine registers, collectively forming a total of nine ranks of pipes housed in the organ chamber. This configuration provides a versatile range of sounds and musical expressions.

GRACE'S FREE CLOSET






PHOTOGRAPHERS WANTED




